The big issue on budget revolved around how much reserve the Club should retain. Some had the opinion that we should spend all our money and we should not be holding money like a bank. Others think that accumulating reserves allows the Club to do impactful projects like the porch on the back of Town Hall.

The other issue revolves around which charities should we support and when.

At the beginning of this year the board approved a budget based on the best information available. We brought Sargent Tovets to our meeting and a few of us took a barbeque grill to his Home at Last house. Earlier we delivered backpacks to local schools and we of course sponsored many students to RYLA and with scholarships.

The Board decided to have a special budget meeting which is planned for Tuesday May 26 starting at 6pm. The location will be announced at Tuesday's meeting and cofirmed by email. All members of the Club are invited to attend. An agenda is being reviewed and anyone interested in how the Club spends the money you have rasied should come.
