

What Is Rotary Corporate Membership?

Corporate Membership

The Rotary Club of Windermere invites corporations to join. The corporation may appoint up to three persons to be its designees, one of whom must be a member of that entity's local management group; the others can be employed by the corporation. The attendance requirement for a corporate member will be the same as an active individual membership. Each designee will be listed as an active member of the club and will be noted in the roster that they are designees of the corporation. If the designee of the eligible corporation is no longer an employee of the eligible corporation they may convert to an individual membership in the club and the individual then will be responsible for all RI dues, club dues and meal/beverage costs, as they become due. Corporate members may have their club logo prominently shown on the club website, and receive discounts for sponsorships of club events, as determined by the Board.

Fees for corporate members:

- Annual dues: \$1,000. This is \$100 more than for 3 active members. The extra \$100 will Go to the club Service Budget or the club's 501(c) (3).
- Meal/beverage costs for one member of the corporation or company shall be billed quarterly (If two or three members attend the same meeting, the additional cost of the second and third meal will be charged.)

Windermere Charities Central Florida (WCCF) Foundation is having a fund raising golf tournament on October 8, 2015 at the Marriott Orlando World Center Resort's Hawk's Landing Golf Course to help the Home at Last Project build a house for disabled Marine Staff Sergeant Brandon Wittwer and his family; wife Kassandra and children Kaydence, Karter and Kylee.

SSgt. Wittwer enlisted in the Marine Corps in 2002. During his deployment to Iraq in 2006 as a Scout Sniper Team Leader, his unit was ambushed. Despite severe head, neck, and back pain as a result of an RPG explosion, SSgt. Wittwer continued to assist injured Marines in his unit. Following rehab and time with his family, SSgt. Wittwer redeployed in 2013. During a training exercise while deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, SSgt. Wittwer suffered further spinal injuries. As a result of these injuries, he was honorably discharged from the Marine Corps in November 2014 with a 100% disability rating. Over time his mobility is expected to be limited to the use of a wheelchair.

Many past and present recipients are scheduled to attend the event. If you are unable to play but still want to "do something to say thanks to the military", please consider becoming a sponsor, donating an auction item, or making a donation.

Come and enjoy a great day of golf, and help provide support for our heroes. The event will include a 4 - person scramble, breakfast buffet, beverage cart, and a special lunch following the golf tournament. After my "Cancer" scare, I decided to do something that I always dreamed of doing, and that was to become a Sailboat Charter Captain with my own boat. I created a company called "Sailing Excursions" and I am in process of buying a 46' Catamaran. The current plan is take the "slow scenic" cruise back to the US and provide days sail out of the Tampa, St. Pete area. However, the vessel will be available for other charters in other locations (BVI, Bahamas, Key West, etc.). I am still working on the details.

I will keep everyone updated on my progress in this next chapter in my life.
