In Loving Memory

Bill Curdts April 4, 1924 - January 3, 2016





William Theodore Curdts, III departed this life on January 3, 2017. His body could no longer keep pace with his mind. Born April 4, 1924 in Craddock, Virginia, he was the only child of William T. Curdts, Jr. and Elizabeth Palmer. A graduate of Wilson High School in Portsmouth, Virginia, he completed two years at VMI (class of 1945) before interrupting his studies to serve his country as a P-47 pilot in the Army Air Corps during the Second World War. When the war ended, he was in California waiting to ship out and never saw combat. After the war he earned a degree in aeronautical engineering from Purdue University.

He worked in Richmond, Virginia as an aeronautical engineer for

Texaco Experiment Incorporated and was later president of the Richmond firm of Flight Research Incorporated. In 1967, he moved with his family to Lake Butler, Windermere, Florida, to pursue business and investment opportunities.

He was a trustee of the University of the South (Sewanee) and was a founding member of the Episcopal Church of the Ascension in Windermere, where he served on the vestry. He was a Paul Harris Fellow of Rotary International and a founding member of the Windermere Rotary Club, where he served as president, treasurer and in various other leadership roles. He also served on the board of directors of the West Orange County chapter of Habitat for Humanity, and with his friend Bill Criswell, co-founded Home at Last, a charitable organization providing "disability-friendly," mortgage-free homes to disabled combat veterans of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 57 years, Mildred "Tatty" Fleming Curdts; and by his daughter, Courtney Curdts Stratton. He is survived by his sister-in-law, Mary Pease Fleming; three sons, William Rives Curdts and his wife, Blair of Hartfield, Virginia; Heath Palmer Curdts and his wife, Nancy of Santa Rosa, California; and Lewis Thomas Curdts and his wife, Ivy Sigel of Denver, Colorado; by his son-in-law, William A. Stratton; and by nine granddaughters, two great-grandsons and a host of friends and admirers. He leaves behind a legacy of honor, integrity, service and good humor, of which we are all beneficiaries.



The 2017 100th Anniversary of our Rotary Foundation will be one of the greatest experiences you will ever have in your Rotary lifetime. Children Can Experience the Beauty of Champion Trees Up High

Get your family engaged outdoors in nature and experience the beauty of champion trees up high! Come to the 13th Windermere Treebute, a Florida Arbor Day Festival and celebrate with a Tree City USA, Saturday, January 21st from 10am-4pm at 512 Main Street. Windermere Tree Board, Green Leaf Safety Training, Windermere Garden Club and Windermere Rotary sponsor the festival with proceeds supporting Windermere's Urban Forestry program. Children can experience the beauty of champion trees up high and see nature from another view at the kids tree climb supervised by ISA Certified Arborists using safety gear. There are trees and plants for sale, an "Ask the Arborist" booth, Eco Activities for families, Enchanted Walk-Abouts to explore nature, food trucks, arts, crafts, live music, an international tree climbing competition, IFAS Master Gardener Plant Clinic and more. Windermere Treebute Florida Arbor Day Festival proceeds support Windermere's Urban Forestry program with purchase of hundreds of trees each year for planting by Windermere Tree Board volunteers and local residents, Saturday, January 21st from 10am-4pm. For those who have mature trees, understory and flowering trees are offered such as Tabebuia, Redbud, Fringe Tree, Flatwoods Plum, Simpson's Stopper and Dogwood.

For edible landscaping, blueberries, mulberry, loquat, citrus trees, apple, peach, pear and plum trees are also available. Florida Native trees such as Mahogany, Elm, Red Maple, Longleaf Pine, Magnolias, Turkey Oak, Red Oak, Live Oak, Cypress, Loblolly Bay, Cedar, Pignut Hickory, Blackgum, Simpson's Stopper, Red Bay and Cypress are offered for adoption and sale to diversify the Urban Forest. Windermere residents may adopt one tree per household. Additional trees and plants may also be purchased for anyone attending the festival.

At the Kids Tree Climb children are placed in child sized professional climbing gear harness, helmet and safety glasses by ISA Certified Arborists and given the experience of climbing majestic trees in Windermere's beautiful Urban Forest. For more nature education, Nehrling Gardens and Windermere Garden Club have eco activities for kids and camellias for sale. "Enchanted Walk-Abouts" with naturalist John Springer are offered to teach children and adults how to see trees and nature with new eyes.

Windermere Tree Board and arborists supply public tree education utilizing the "Ask the Arborist Booth" where residents get advice from ISA Certified Arborists and Duke Energy regarding the "Right Tree for the Right Place" in their yards. IFAS Master Gardener Mobile Plant Clinic is also available for horticultural and pest control questions.

"Geezers in the Treezers" Tree Climbing Competition where Certified Arborists over age 40 compete in 5 different tree climbing competitions stressing advanced tree arboriculture skills and emergency rescue techniques. Competitors come from the U.S., Canada and Britain to compete in Windermere's historic tree canopy.

Open to the public is the pre-festival Arbor Day Ceremony and Tree Planting on Thursday, January 19, at 10 am, At Windermere Town Hall Square coordinated by Windermere Garden Club and Windermere Tree Board with a Mayoral proclamation, Police color guard, children singing tree songs, planting the Arbor Day tree, public tree care education by arborists and refreshments. It is perfect for families with toddlers and Pre-K children.
